


1958 Chrysler 300D Projects for Sale by Club Member..










CLUB WORKING BEE AT BRIAN & WENDY'S

CHRYSLER TRIVIA #1

During early Valiant AP5 production, approximately November 1963, Chrysler Australia used imported instrument clusters on 730 vehicles, including the first three Safari station wagons. These clusters contained gauges manufactured by Stewart Warner in the US. All other AP5s used locally sourced VDO gauges.


Vehicles fitted with these Stewart Warner clusters are even rarer today being over 60 years old now. Does anyone recall ever seeing an AP5 with these gauges? They would stand out because they read "alternator", "temperature" and "gasoline" whereas all other AP5s with the VDO gauges read "amps", "temp", and "fuel", as did all other model Valiants.

The speedometer was a Stewart Warner part as well. The imported Stewart Warner clusters were effective from serial numbers:

Manual sedan AP5/2-2617 to 2839; Auto sedan AP5/4-2127 to 2423; Regal sedan AP5/4H-1632 to 1838 and the first three Safari station wagons both manual & auto (not Regal Safari).
