PARKING AT CLUBROOMS


Parking at the clubrooms should be in the lined parking bays ONLY. For







A very small number of these cars were manufactured by Chrysler Australia in 1970/71. The exact number is not known officially and varies anywhere between 76 and 200, according to youtubers & facebookers. I can't recall ever seeing one when the VG model was a current model.

From information available in the VG parts catalogue & brochures available on line, it seems Chrysler didn't market them as "Mexicana", and were simply optioned as "roof extension package", option code A78. There were no Mexicana badges fitted to these cars according to the parts catalogue.

Contrary to theories that they were built with specially imported roofs or that they were added by the dealers, the parts required may have been sourced locally and the extensions (in two pieces) were welded to the bodies before painting and the fitting of the unique vinyl roof covers and mouldings.

Parts for A78 option as listed as in VG parts catalogue:

The moulding hardware listed looks like they are local part numbers. The mouldings and extension part numbers commencing with "F" are numbers I don't remember in my time selling Chrysler parts. It's possible Chrysler just used the supplier's part numbers in this case. They did this sometimes with heater components etc.

CHRYSLER TRIVIA #7 PART 2 - VALIANT AP6 SAFARI WAGONS

Canadian wagons built in 1965 were a different story.

The front clips were much like the US models except for badging etc. But their base model wagon (Valiant 100) used US sourced horizontal tail lamps, the same as the majority of our Australian built AP6s.



Image of an Australian built 1965 AP6 wagon with horizontal tail lamps, used on almost 60% of the build (6337 out of 10,853). This is very much like the 1965 Canadian base model Valiant 100 which had essentially the same front as the US model which used these tail lamps as well. These early Australian wagons used mostly imported panels such as doors, roof, quarter panels, tailgate, rear bumper etc. etc.

Wagons with imported components can easily be identified by a bulge in the quarter panel forward of the bumper bar.
